Coaches/Players

- *face coverings optional*
- *pre-game plate meeting permitted (Social Distance)*
- *no pre or post-game handshakes*
- *Only players and Coaches in Dugouts.*
- *no team water coolers in dugouts*
- *sanitize dugout prior to and after games*
- *must exit facility immediately following the game*

Patrons

- *face coverings optional*
- *individual Gate Fee*
 - ⇒ *\$10 Daily*
 - ⇒ *\$15 Weekend*
 - ⇒ *12 Under Free*
- *Exact Change Recommended*
- *social distancing enforced (6ft)*
- *sitting with family members is permitted (no more than 10 in a group)*
- *Utilize entire field for viewership (not only around dugout and backstop)*
- *must exit facility following the game*

Officials

- *face coverings optional*
- *pre-game plate meeting permitted (Social Distance)*
- *no hand shakes*
- *social distancing required when possible*
- *Umpires will be in position behind catcher*
- *Umpires will have temperatures taken before first games*

Staff

- *face coverings mandatory*
- *social distancing required*
- *concession staff must wear mask and gloves*
- *sanitization stations setup at Entry and Exit Gates*
- *Staff will have temperatures taken before entering facility*

Safety Guidelines Explained

Rawlings Tournament Series is committed to returning to action with a common-sense approach to ensuring safety at the ballpark. We have outlined several safety recommendations for all attendees and encourage they follow these guidelines to the best of their ability. We encourage teams to create their own safety guidelines to ensure their players and coaches are safe at the ballpark. Below is similar information as noted on page 1 with some additional explanation of the safety policies.

**** If you are experiencing fever or symptoms of illness of any kind, please do not enter the ballpark ****

Teams, Players, and Coaches

- Wait outside the facility until 30 minutes before game time and be ready to play 15 minutes before game time.
- Minimize player and coach contact by eliminating handshakes and high fives
- Use others means of celebrating and team sportsmanship at the end of a game (ie: tipping the cap)
- Use social distancing guidelines when in dugout (players and coaches only)
- All teams to clean their dugout and sanitize after each game
- Prior to each game, teams should disinfect/sanitize the dugout
- No team water coolers permitted in the dugouts

Patrons, Fans, and Parents

- Wait outside the facility until 10 minutes before game time or a text from your coach with clearance to come in
- Spectators will need to bring own chairs to sit in. Practice social distancing from non-family members while watching the game.
- Wash/sanitize hands regularly

Officials

- Must practice physical distancing when possible
- Encouraged to wear face coverings during the games
- Pre-game plate meetings are allowed, but physical distancing is required
- If umpire locker room is available, practice physical distancing. Hand Sanitizer will be available.

Staff

- Wash/sanitize hands regularly
- Spray dugouts after each game with disinfectant
- No handshakes with staff, players, coaches, and attendees; practice physical distancing
- Encourage all attendees to practice physical distancing at the ballpark
- Create one-way entry and exit gates where possible
- Restrooms must be sanitized every two hours and re-stocked with anti-bacterial hand soap
- Must wear face coverings at the ballpark (+gloves if handling money at concessions and/ or gate)
